107. ***Mr. Muhammad Talha Mahmood:** (Notice received on 31-07-2009 at 09:00 a.m.)

Will the Minister for Health be pleased to state:

- (a) the main functions and responsibilities of the Pakistan Medical Research Council; and*
- (b) the salient achievements of the Council during the last three years?*

Mir Aijaz Hussain Jakhrani: (a) The main functions and responsibilities of PMRC as per Resolution 1985 Published in Gazette of Pakistan are as follows:—

Functions:

1. Organize, coordinate, promote and undertake scientific research in various disciplines of medical sciences and public health.
2. Establish its own institutions for undertaking medical research.
3. Ensure that medical research activity is linked with the national socioeconomic development plans.
4. Publish and disseminate technical and general information on scientific matters relating to the research work of the Council.
5. Establish scientific liaison with other national and international organizations connected with the scientific activities of the Council.
6. Advise the Federal and Provincial Governments on all matters related to medical research
7. Carry out, when called upon, evaluation of different health programme in the country.

Salient achievements of PMRC during last three years:

1. National survey on prevalence of Hepatitis B & C in general population of Pakistan.
 2. Institutionalization of health systems research (HSR) Establishment of HSR centers and development of field experimental areas.
 3. Hospital based rotavirus gastroenteritis surveillance.
 4. Rational use of antimicrobial agents Pakistan strategies for containment of antimicrobial resistance.
 5. Development and printing of guidelines for snakebite management in Pakistan.
 6. Collaborated for the development of guidelines for human rabies in Pakistan.
 7. Development of draft career structure for health professional.
 8. 165 projects funded during last three years.
 9. Regularly publishing Pakistan Journal of medical research.

111. ***Dr. Muhammad Ismail Buledi:** (Notice received on 01-08-2009 at 09:15 a.m.)

Will the Minister for Health be pleased to state the number of persons appointed in the Ministry during the last one year with grade-wise and province-wise break up?

Mir Aijaz Hussain Jakhrani: (a) List showing the names of employees, designation and place of domicile is **Annex-A**.

125. ***Col. (R) Syed Tahir Hussain Mashhadi:** (Notice received on 10-09-2009 at 09:00 a.m.)

Will the Minister for Health be pleased to state:

(a) *the number of cases registered for smoking at public places in the country since January, 2008; and*

(b) *the steps taken by the Government to control smoking at public places and the results achieved so far?*

Mir Aijaz Hussain Jakhrani: (a) Islamabad Police has submitted 46 challans in courts which are subjudice. Since the cases are registered by local authorities all over the country, information is not available at the federal level.

(b) The government has taken following steps to control smoking in the public places:—

(1) Establishment of independent Tobacco Control Cell for the implementation of “Prohibition of Smoking and Protection of Non-smokers Health Ordinance 2002” and “Framework Convention on Tobacco Control”.

(2) Withdrawal of S.R.O No.956(I)/2008 which allowed Designated Smoking Areas resulting in 100% smoke free indoor public places.

(3) Continuous Health Education campaigns using all communication channels.

- (4) Revitalization of Provincial and District Implementation Committees formed under the directives of the Supreme Court.
- (5) The Ministry of Health is not the only organization to ensure that public places are smoke free. All the head of the organizations have been declared authorized persons under Section 4 of the ordinance.
- (6) The Ministry of Health has delegated its powers for the implementation of the Ordinance to the Provinces and the ICT.

The results achieved so far are as under:

- (1) A culture of no smoking has been created.
- (2) Smoking in public transport has declined considerably. Pakistan Railways has taken special measures to stop smoking the trains.
- (3) Some of the institutions have declared themselves smoke free *e.g.* PIMS, JPMC, FGSH etc.
- (4) Designated smoking areas in public places have been prohibited.
- (5) All the federal government educational institutions have been declared smoke free.
- (6) Some of the universities and medical colleges have declared themselves smoke free.

127. ***Dr. Muhammad Ismail Buledi:** (Notice received on 16-09-2009 at 09:40 a.m.)

Will the Minister for Health be pleased to state:

- (a) *the names and other details of the companies to whom permission has been granted for import and distribution of medicines in the country during the last two years;*
- (b) *the steps taken by the Government for the quality control of medicines; and*
- (c) *the action taken by the Government against the companies for supplying substandard and spurious medicines during the said period?*

Mir Aijaz Hussain Jakhrani: (a) The names of the companies to whom permission for import of medicines was granted during the last two years may be seen at Annex A & B.

(b) The major steps taken by the Government to improve quality of drugs manufactured in Pakistan includes:—

- (i) A comprehensive legislation in the form of Drugs Act 1976 is in operation which covers all the vital aspects including detail Good Manufacturing Practices

guidelines on all important drug manufacturing aspects like manufacturing site, its layout, processing, quality control, documentation etc.

- (ii) Drugs manufacturing sites and authorizations for sale of individual drugs are approved by Central Licensing & Drug Registration Boards respectively after ensuring availability of appropriate manufacturing facilities and scrutiny of the safety, efficacy and quality aspects.
- (iii) The Federal Inspector of Drugs posted throughout the country closely monitor the manufacturing the sites. Random sampling of drugs for test/analysis is also done to assess the quality.
- (iv) Seven drug testing laboratories in Federal & Provincial Governments for test/analysis of drug samples picked by the Drug Inspectors throughout the country.
- (v) The Provincial Drug Inspectors also monitors the quality of drug through regular market surveillance which includes random sampling for test/analysis and evaluation of storage conditions of drugs to ensure their quality.
- (vi) The Central Licensing Board, Drug Registration Board, Provincial Quality Control Board and the Drug Courts established under Drug Act 1976 take up the cases of violations including those related to drug quality and awards appropriate punishment to those found guilty.

Mir Aijaz Hussain Jakhrani: (a) International Health Agencies did not offer any scholarships for long duration study abroad during last three years. However, they offered fellowships for short trainings abroad during this period (Annexure-I).

(b) The Economic Affairs Division is responsible for scholarships/trainings abroad. They seek nominations from provincial Governments directly. Ministry of Health seeks nominations from federal health institutions, which do not make a distinction of domicile. List of the doctors sent abroad in at Annexure-II.

(c) The offers of training courses are circulated to the relevant National Program Managers and Federal Health Institutions for nominations of relevant candidates, Subsequently, Ministry of Health nominates suitable official (s) in the light of criteria laid down by the sponsoring organizations/agencies. The Secretary Health is competent for nomination of training abroad upto BPS-20. For the officers BPS-21 and above, Minister for Health is the approving authority.
