5. ***Mr. Muhammad Talha Mahmood:** (Notice received on 02-03-2010 at 08.45 a.m.)

Will the Minister for Law, Justice and Parliamentary Affairs be pleased to state:

- (a) *the amount recovered by NAB since its establishment with year-wise break up; and*
- (b) *the amount paid to the officers and other employees of NAB out of the same as reward etc. with year-wise break up?*

95. ***Hafiz Rashid Ahmad:** (Notice received on 16-03-2010 at 09.12 p.m.)

Will the Minister for Law, Justice and Parliamentary Affairs be pleased to state:

- (a) *the number of cases for more than five years lying pending in the Federal Services Tribunal, indicating also the reasons for pendency; and*
- (b) *the number of petitioners who were provided counsels or lawyers by the Government for their cases in the said Tribunal during the last five years with year-wise break up?*

Dr. Zaheeruddin Babar Awan: (a) 2142 appeals of Civil Servants and Corporation employees are lying pending for more than 5 years in the main seat of Federal Service Tribunal and its Camp Offices at Lahore and Karachi. The reasons for delay in the disposal of such old appeals are as under:—

- (i) The post of the Chairman and Members remained vacant for the period showing at Annex-A-1 & Annex-A-2.
- (ii) A large number of Miscellaneous Petitions come up before the Tribunal for implementation of its Judgments because most of the Ministries/Divisions/Departments do not implement the judgments of the Tribunal with the result that the appellants/petitioners have to come to the Tribunal once again to get the Judgments implemented. Most of the Tribunal's time is consumed in the disposal of such Misc. Petitions before starting the Regular Hearing of appeals.

- (iii) That due to insertion of Section 2-A in Service Tribunals Act in 1997 and promulgation of Removal from Service (Special Powers) Ordinance, 2000 a huge number of cases were transferred to the Tribunal which were pending in various forums like High Courts, Civil Courts and Labour Courts throughout the country but, the Strength of Members remained same.
- (iv) In most of the cases the Ministries, Divisions and Departments keep On delaying the filing of comments / objections to the appellants' appeals. They continue taking time to file objections/comments on one pretext or the other and as such sufficient long time is wasted in becoming of the appeals ripe for regular hearing. A lot of time is therefore, consumed to obtain objections from the respondents by the Tribunal.
- (v) Due to judicial crises for about year wise yet another reason for delay in the disposal of cases.
- (vi) Paucity of staff is also one of the factors which resulted in delay in the disposal of appeals.
- (vii) Due to insufficient budgetary grant necessary equipments like Computers, Photocopiers, Generators and other allied articles could not be obtained which too is / was a reason in delay in disposal of appeals:
- (viii) In-fact question of jurisdiction remained sub-judice before Supreme Court of Pakistan after pronouncement of Judgment in Mubeen-us-Salam's case (2006 PLD .(SC)602) / 2006 SCMR 1081 and thereafter other Judgments of the apex court in interpretation of its said Judgments.

(b) There is no provision in the Service Tribunals (Procedure). Rules, 1974, to provide advocates to the Petitioners / aggrieved persons on the state expenses and neither any appellant nor any other aggrieved person (before filing of appeal) applied for providing of Counsel on Government expenses enabling the Federal Service Tribunal or controlling Ministry/Division to initiate the case for grant of such like relief, for the approval of Competent Authority.

167. ***Dr. Muhammad Ismail Buledi:** (Notice received on 01-03-2010 at 08.54 a.m.)

Will the Minister for Law, Justice and Parliamentary Affairs be pleased to state the number of cases of murder, kidnapping and terrorism disposed off by each High Court during the last two years indicating also the number of cases pending in each High Court?

Dr. Zaheeruddin Babar Awan: Quertes concerned have been requested to provide the requisite information. The same will be tabled in the house as soon as received.

180. ***Hafiz Rashid Ahmad:** (Notice received on 22-03-2010 at 16.40 p.m.)

Will the Minister for Law, Justice and Parliamentary Affairs be pleased to state:

- (a) the amount received by the Government under the Access to Justice Programme from various sources as loans and grants during the last five years with year-wise break up indicating also the rate of mark up on the said loans; and*
- (b) the utilization of the said amount during that period with head-wise and year-wise break up?*

Dr. Zaheeruddin Babar Awan: (a) The Government of Pakistan received US\$ 202.32 million under Access to Justice Program from, Asian Development Bank (ADB) as loan under three different loan agreements during the last five years. The loan wise and year wise break up indicating rate of mark up on each loan is at **Annex-A**.

(b) The ADB credited the said amount of loan in favour of the Government of Pakistan. As per Government's budgetary Procedure, funds were subsequently allocated to AJP through Public Sector Development Program on yearly basis to finance the AJP mandated schemes. The head wise and year wise utilization is at **Annex-B**

(b) *the names and value of the medicines provided to the said patients?*

Makhdoom Shahabuddin: (a) The number of patients who were provided medicines free of cost by PIMS and FGSH, Islamabad during the last 03 years is as under:—

Will the Minister for Health be pleased to state the names of the Federal Government Hospitals in the country where the facility of plastic surgery is available, indicating also

the number of plastic surgeries carried out in each of those hospitals during the last three years?

Makhdoom Shahabuddin: The facility of Plastic Surgery is available in JPMC, Karachi and PIMS, Islamabad. The total number of plastic surgeries carried out during the last three years are **766 in JPMC, Karachi and 2745 in PIMS, Islamabad.**

5. ***Mr. Muhammad Talha Mahmood:** (Notice received on 16-04-2010 at 12.00 p.m.)

Will the Minister for Health be pleased to state:

- (a) the number of lady health workers presently posted in district Haripur; and*
- (b) whether there is any proposal under consideration of the Government to post more lady health workers in that district, if so, its details?*

Makhdoom Shahabuddin: (a) Total number of Lady Health Workers (LHWs) working in District Haripur are **735.**

(b) Total allocation of LHWs for Haripur District, is 770. 35 vacancies exist due to attrition. These vacancies will be filled after the PC-I 2010-15 will be approved ECNEC and budget for new recruitment becomes available.
