- 7. It was the contention of the Ministry of Defence that the budgetary allocations in respect of the three armed forces should be directly related to the threat perception which is markedly enhanced due to the current geo-political situation and Pakistan's strategic location in the area. The Ministry of Defence also informed the meeting that out of the \$ 13 billion received of the Coalition Support Funds from the United States since 9/11, 40% has gone to the civilian government. The current year being the last year in respect of the Coalition Support Fund, a balance amount of \$ 200 million remains to be cleared by the United States government.
- During the recent meeting of "Pak-US Strategic Dialogue" a proposal of establishing a border management fund to the tune of \$100 million was discussed. The Ministry of Defence has put forward a proposal for the development of Federally Administrative Tribal Areas (FATA) to the tune of \$ 8 billion spread over 5 to 8 years. The government of United States has agreed that a robust border management is essential for maintenance of peace on Pak-Afghan border & further negotiations on the matter continue.
- 9. The Ministry of Defence made the following recommendations in respect of its budgetary allocations;
  - Sales Tax and Custom duty may be waived off on all defence imports.
  - IBC for Defence Budget 2016-17 may be revised from Rs 860 Bn to Rs 920 Bn.
  - iii. Pay and Pension Commission may be constituted.
- iv. One rank one pension formula may be adopted for Defence Services.
- v. Power to waive-off 'Austerity Measures of defence organizations may be delegated to Secretary Defence.
- vi. 40% deduction from CSF reimbursements by GoP may be discontinued.

10. The Chairman DEFCOM & the Senate Standing Committee on Defence adopted this report and approved its laying before the Honourable House.
