- Sana Jamali in the Senate session held on 11<sup>th</sup> April, 2018 that was referred to the Committee, regarding declination of the juniper forests at District Ziarat, Balochsitan. The Committee was of the opinion that it was a provincial subject. However, realized seriousness of the issue and took up for deliberations. The Committee expressed intention of visiting Ziarat in order to check the illegal cutting of not only Juniper forests but also Pinus Gerardana commonly known as 'Chilghoza' trees and taking up matter with the provincial government for corrective measures for protection of Juniper forests.
- 6. Senator Sana Jamali, Mover, informed the Committee that Juniper forests in Ziarat, are the second largest in the world and have scenic value though it has slow growth rate but outlasts by many years. She added that the area has significant importance of being a national heritage for the country where the Founder of Nation spent his last days. She stressed for protection of Juniper forests. She also highlighted the importance for medicinal uses of Juniper and informed that these forests have been declared as Biosphere Reserve under the UNESCO's Man and Biosphere programme.
- Advisor to Prime Minister on Climate Change appreciated Senator Sana Jamali for raising an important issue and agreed to its unique type of forest due to high ecological significance. The Committee was informed that one of the major reasons for degradation of these forests was fuel wood and grazing rights of local communities due to which natural regeneration was badly affected. The Advisor added that government was giving thoughtful attention towards the waning situation of forests and the federal government has initiated programme consisting of two parts; one of which was billion-Tree Tsunami project and other of Green Pakistan Initiative for revival of vulnerable forests. He further informed that budget allocation has been planned and it shall be equally shared

between Federal and Provincial governments. The framework shall be provided by the Federal Government and provinces would be made responsible to implement it by involving local communities. An allocation of 64 million has been made for revival of Juniper and Chilghoza forests in Balochistan that would be released in the coming days. The Advisor assured the Committee that expeditious measures would be taken in coordination with provincial government to address the issue of Juniper forests and outcome of Ministry's efforts would be shared with the Committee.

The Committee disposed-off the point of public importance.
