PRESENTATION OF REPORT OF THE FUNCTIONAL COMMITTEE

Senator Keshoo Bai on behalf of Senator Mustafa Nawaz Khokhar, Chairman, Functional Committee on Human Rights, presented report of the Committee on the Bill to control and prevent torture and custodial death [The Torture and Custodial Death (Prevention and Punishment) Bill, 2020], introduced by Senator Sherry Rehman on 10th February, 2020.

PRIVATE MEMBERS' BILLS TO BE INTRODUCED

- **1.** Senator Prof. Dr. Mehr Taj Roghani, moved for leave to introduce a Bill further to amend the ICT Rights of Persons with Disability Act, 2020 [The ICT Rights of Persons with Disability (Amendment) Bill, 2021].
 - The Motion was opposed by the Minister for Human Rights.

The Bill was deferred with the consent of the Member in Charge.

- 2. Senator Muhammad Javed Abbasi, moved for leave to introduce a Bill further to amend the Code of Criminal Procedure, 1898 [The Code of Criminal Procedure (Amendment) Bill, 2021] (Amendment of Sections 513 and 514). Motion was not opposed by the Minister of State for Parliamentary Affairs. Leave to introduce the Bill was granted by the House.
 - The Bill as introduced was referred to the Standing Committee concerned for consideration and report.

3. Senator Muhammad Javed Abbasi, moved for leave to introduce a Bill further to amend the Pakistan Penal Code, 1860 [The Pakistan Penal Code (Amendment) Bill, 2021] (Amendment of Section 489F). Motion was not opposed by the Minister of State for Parliamentary Affairs. Leave to introduce the Bill was granted by the House.

The Bill as introduced was referred to the Standing Committee concerned for consideration and report.

4. Senator Muhammad Javed Abbasi, moved for leave to introduce a Bill further to amend the Customs Act, 1969 [The Customs (Amendment) Bill, 2021]. Motion was opposed by the Minister of State for Parliamentary Affairs.

The Bill was deferred with the consent of the Member in Charge.

5. Senator Muhammad Javed Abbasi, moved for leave to introduce a Bill further to amend the Children (Pledging of Labour) Act, 1933 [The Children (Pledging of Labour) (Amendment) Bill, 2021]. Motion was not opposed by the Minister for Human Rights.

Leave to introduce the Bill was granted by the House.

The Bill as introduced was referred to the Standing Committee concerned for consideration and report.

- **6.** Senator Muhammad Ali Khan Saif, to move for leave to introduce a Bill further to amend the Constitution of the Islamic Republic of Pakistan [The Constitution (Amendment) Bill, 2020] (Amendment of Articles 63A, 64 and 160). **The Bill was deferred due to absence of the Member in Charge.**
- 7. Senator Muhammad Javed Abbasi, moved for leave to introduce a Bill further to amend the Civil Servants Act, 1973 [The Civil Servants (Amendment) Bill, 2021]. Motion was not opposed by the Minister of State for Parliamentary Affairs.

Leave to introduce the Bill was granted by the House.

The Bill as introduced was referred to the Standing Committee concerned for consideration and report.

8. Senator Muhammad Javed Abbasi, to move for leave to introduce a Bill further to amend the Service Tribunals Act, 1973 [The Service Tribunals (Amendment) Bill, 2021]. Motion was not opposed by the Minister of State for Parliamentary Affairs. Leave to introduce the Bill was granted by the House. The Bill as introduced was referred to the Standing Committee concerned for consideration and report.

5. Senator Mian Muhammad Ateeq Shaikh to move that the Bill further to amend the Transplantation of Human Organs and Tissues Act, 2010 [The Transplantation of Human Organs and Tissues (Amendment) Bill, 2018], as reported by the Standing Committee, be taken into consideration, at once.

The Bill was deferred on written request of the Member in Charge.

6. Senator Muhammad Javed Abbasi to move that the Bill further to amend the Constitution of the Islamic Republic of Pakistan [The Constitution (Amendment) Bill, 2020] (Amendment of Article 140), as reported by the Standing Committee, be taken into consideration, at once.

The Bill was deferred due to lack of required number for constitutional amendment i.e. $2/3^{rd}$ of total membership of the House.

7. Senator Muhammad Javed Abbasi moved that the Bill to provide for making compulsory teaching of Arabic Language to the students in all educational institutions [The Compulsory Teaching of Arabic Language Bill, 2020], as reported by the Standing Committee, be taken into consideration, at once.
