(Def.) *Question No. 49 **Senator Bahramand Khan Tangi:**
(Notice Received on 12/11/2020 at 10:30 AM) QID: 37481

Will the Minister for Interior be pleased to state whether it is a fact that street crimes are on the rise in Islamabad at present, if so, the details thereof indicating also the steps being taken by the Government for protection of general public from street criminals?

Sheikh Rashid Ahmed: It is submitted that the following cases were registered against the snatchers. The comparative statement for the year 2020 & 2021 regarding street crimes *i.e.* purse/mobile/jewelry/cash and vehicles / motorcycles snatching is as under:

In these cases 401 accused persons were arrested and recovery of amounting Rs. 2,13,62000/- including mobile phones, Cars/Motor Cycles, jewelries were recovered from the accused persons. After completion of investigation accused persons sent to judicial custody challans against them have been submitted in the court where they are facing trial.

However, the ICT Police has taken the following steps to curb the street crimes as well as protection of general public:-

- Identification of Crime pockets.
- Crime cluster Analysis.
- Data Base (survey of Kachi Abadies)
- Intelligence Based Policing.
- Combing/Search Operations.
- Random checking of Guest Houses/Hotel/Motel.
- Survey of Rented Accommodation, illegal settlements. Surveillance of suspected Elements.
- Data proofing of released prisoners.
- Under the direction of present government Eagle Squad consisted of 150 motorcycles including 510 Police officers/officials have been established on the pattern of Dolphin Force in Punjab on 16-06-2021 to control street crimes in the Federal Capital. The street crimes ratio has been decreased more than 50% after establishment of Eagle Squad.

Sheikh Rashid Ahmed: (a) & (b) There is no Law in ICT regarding prohibition/regulation of sale purchase of dangerous acids.

Will the Minister for Interior be pleased to state:

- (a) *the system installed for the provision of water to the residents of Islamabad;*
- (b) *the location-wise service of water tankers is available along with average number of requests received and entertained for the supply of water tanks by the residents on daily basis on each location;*
- (c) *whether CDA has given authorized private water tankers for the supply of water to the residents of Islamabad, if so, the details thereof; along with terms and conditions thereof; and authorized points from where private water tankers can get water along with authorized rate thereof;*
- (d) *whether CDA has taken notice of theft of water from its lines by private water tankers, if so, the details thereof; and*
- (e) *what steps are being taken to upgrade the installed system for the provision of water to the residents of Islamabad expeditiously and ensure smooth supply of water in upcoming summer season?*

Sheikh Rashid Ahmed: (a) The potable water to the residents of Sectorial areas including Model Villages of Islamabad is being supplied from Simly Dam, Khan Pur Dam, Rawal Dam, Small Water Works sources (Shahdara, Saidpur, Noorpur, Korang) & Tube Wells installed at different locations for provision of water to the residents of Islamabad.

(b) Location-wise service of water tanker & average number of complaints on daily basis for the last week *w.e.f.* 07-07-2021 to 13-07-2021 is as under:-

(c) CDA has not authorized private water tankers service for supply of water to the residents of Islamabad. However, 12 tankers have been allowed to cater the demand of residents of Sector G-13 & G-14 on the demand of Federal Government Employees Housing Authority. (list attached)

(d) No theft of water from CDA lines by the private tankers has been noticed nor reported from any sources.

(e) The repair / maintenance of tube wells, control valves & leakages in conduction main & distribution networks are being carried out as & when occurred. Rehabilitation of Tube Wells against abandoned Tube Wells new boring for installation of Tube Wells is also being carried out to minimize the supply – demand gap. During the period March to July, 2021, approx. 9.5 MGD water has been saved by controlling the leakages. However, illegal water connections from Simly Dam Main Conduction Lines still exist, for removal of which a grand operation is required with the help of law enforcing agencies to avoid law & order situation as the water is being consumed in rural areas.

(Def.) *Question No. 13 **Senator Fida Muhammad:**

Will the Minister for Interior be to state the schemes and plans launched with regard to safe city project in Islamabad during last five years?

Sheikh Rashid Ahmed: Safe City project was executed by NADRA and ICT Police was the end user. However, Safe City Project was handed over to ICT Police by NADRA in July, 2019. Before handing taking, NADRA being executing agency may be asked to share report regarding schemes & plans that they have taken. After July, 2019 the following schemes & plans have been launched / taken by ICT Police:

- i. Smart Cars have been launched in the Federal Capital for on ground surveillance.
- ii. E-Challan System which was non-functional has been made functional. Now, E-Challans are being issued to violators.
- iii. When the project was handed over to ICT Police, 40% cameras were in working condition. Now, the ratio has been increased and presently 98% cameras are functional.
- iv. 7x eLTE Towers out of 20 Towers were functional at the time of handing taking over, now 18x eLTE Towers are fully functional.
- v. A proposal for installation of additional 4500 cameras has been prepared and submitted to the Ministry of Interior for approval.
- vi. 16x additional Smart Cars equipped with latest technology have been approved to ensure Safety & Security in Islamabad.
- vii. Air Patrol Unit has been established for surveillance through drone cameras.
- viii. Eagle Squad has been integrated with this modern technology based project to provide better services to the citizens in grave emergency situations.
- ix. Safe City ACT-2021 has been sent to Ministry of Law & Justice for vetting & consideration by CCLC.
- x. A proposal / PC-I regarding up-gradation of CAD (Computer Aided Dispatch) System has been prepared and submitted for approval.
- xi. Local cameras installed at societies and shopping malls are being integrated with Safe City.

(Def.) *Question No. 16 **Senator Mushtaq Ahmed:**

Will the Minister for Interior be pleased to state:

- (a) *since how long IJP road, Islamabad has not been properly repaired and carpeted by CDA from Faizabad to Pirwadhai, causing great hardships to the citizens of twin cities; and*

- (b) *the steps being taken by CDA for reconstruction or complete repair / maintenance of IJP road?*

Sheikh Rashid Ahmed: (a) The major repair work of Triple Surface Treatment (T.S.T) at IJP Road was carried out in 2016-17. The routine repair / maintenance of IJP Road Islamabad *i.e.* patchwork is being carried out periodically.

(b) The PC-1 amounting to Rs. 6739.000 M has been approved. The consultants have been appointed and detailed design alongwith estimates for the work are under approval. The time for completion of work is two years from the award of work. The work is scheduled to be started by the current financial year 2021-22.

(Def.) *Question No. 18 **Senator Kamran Murtaza:**

Will the Minister for Interior be pleased to state:

- (a) *whether it is a fact that new policy has been devised by the Government regarding the allotment of kiosks / khokhas in Islamabad, if so, details thereof;*
- (b) *whether it is also a fact that cases of earmarking of 485 kiosks/ khokhas are pending with the Planning Directorate of CDA, if so, reasons thereof; and*
- (c) *the tentative time by which earmarking of the above 485 kiosks / khokhas will be finalized and the affectees of these kiosks / khokhas will be restored?*

Sheikh Rashid Ahmed: (a) Yes, as per recommendations of the Standing Committee on Interior Planning Wing framed the new policy regarding regulations for earmarking of kiosks/Khokhas sites Annexure-A.

(b) Yes.

(c) As and when Planning Wing CDA will earmark the sites of Kiosk / Khokhas, Municipal Administration will start the restoration as per rules and regulations.

- (c) Temporary structure at any site without a T.S. number or permit shall be demolished.
- (d) On completion of the main project, the temporary structure shall be removed immediately and the site cleared. In this connection, the allottee/department concerned shall provide a guarantee for the cell of B. & B.C., CDA.
- (e) Completion certificate/final bill of a project shall only be entertained when the temporary structures are removed and the site cleared from debris, etc.
- (f) The debris shall be disposed off under the directions of the Cell Incharge. In case of violation, punitive action shall be taken against the defaulter.

POLICY REGARDING LOCATION OF CABIN SHOPS, KIOSKS, TEA STALLS AND TEMPORARY STRUCTURES IN ISLAMABAD.

CHAPTER I.—INTRODUCTION

With the development of Islamabad, some shabby and ugly structures in the form of khokhas and other temporary structures had also cropped up in an unplanned and haphazard manner in certain areas which could not obviously be allowed. The khokhas were thus gradually removed and some kiosks and tea stalls were permitted according to the designs prepared by the Authority. It was however later on felt that the location of these kiosks and tea stalls was not proper and strict control and a uniform pattern for the future was necessary. Temporary structures usually connected with construction projects similarly were occupied by unauthorised persons after the original purpose was fulfilled and continued to remain in use in pursuance of an unauthorised trade or purpose. With a view to achieving a systematised pattern this policy has been framed, main features of which are given in the succeeding chapters.

CHAPTER II.—LOCATION

2. For the location of cabin shops, etc. the following three areas can be identified :—

- (i) in developing sectors ;
- (ii) along peripheral service roads and around a sector and highways in the urban areas ; and
- (iii) in parks and recreational places.

CHAPTER III.—GUIDELINES

3. Following are the guidelines :—

- (i) *In developing sectors.*—There is always a time lag between the development of houses and opening up of shops. While houses keep coming up—a few here and a few there, the shops come into being only when sufficient clientele is ensured. To bridge the lag an interim arrangement need to be made to facilitate shopping to the community where Bazar (Class-III Shopping Centres) are expected to take some time to develop. Location of 2 or 3 cabin shops (8' × 8') and a tea stall (12' × 14') in the area of Bazar could serve this purpose. Cabin shops would provide the daily provisions and tea stall beside serving tea would also sell prepared food (eliminating the requirement of labour canteen). Purely temporary in nature these would be constructed by the CDA and licensed out for operation till the Bazar is fully developed.
- (ii) *Along peripheral service road of sectors and Highways in the urban area.*—The community oriented concept of shopping centres has rendered the Bazar and Markaz invisible from the peripheral service roads of sector. There is a need for petty wayside shopping of the travellers along the service road e.g. for cigarettes, cold drinks, newspapers, guide map, etc. A well designed small kiosk on 8' × 8' site at each corner of the sector along the service road shall therefore be a pleasant feature. It should be sited in the green verge of the Avenues at a distance of about 200 feet from the existing building line. A similar kiosk along the Highway associated with the Bus Stop or Petrol Pump shall also be constructed by CDA and licensed out on prescribed terms and conditions.

- (iii) *In the Parks and Recreational Areas.*—Though in all large parks and recreational areas provision of a restaurant or a cafe is invariably made yet some of the remote interesting points would require provision of a small kiosk (8' × 8'), catering for casual shopping, drinks and snacks. This could be built by CDA and licensed out as in other cases.

CHAPTER IV.—CONDITIONS OF LICENSE

4. (a) License shall be issued on the following basis :—
- (i) 20 per cent for invalid/handicapped persons who can run the khokhas/tea stalls.
 - (ii) 60 per cent to the owners of the existing khokhas, cabin shops, tea stalls and kiosks.
 - (iii) 20 per cent discretionary quota of CDA Board.
- (b) Applicants shall be asked to pay advance of license fee, as may be determined by the Authority from time to time, along with security deposit of Rs. 5,000.
- (c) The license period shall not be more than three years at a time. This can however be renewed after expiry of this period.

CHAPTER V.—TEMPORARY STRUCTURES

5. Construction of temporary structures in Capital area shall be as under :—
- (a) Temporary structures like stores, site offices, etc., with new constructions both in public and private sectors shall only be allowed when duly applied for and approved by the Cell of B. & B.C., CDA.
 - (b) The cell of B. & B.C., CDA, shall allot a temporary structure Number (E.S. No.) for the same after verification of site plan, etc, and this No. shall be displayed on the face of the structure.



KHOKHAS'

1. When I visited different areas of the Federal Capital, on 30 Oct 79, I was pleased to note the efforts being made to improve its environmental aspects. I would like particularly to commend CDA's determined bid to remove encroachments. There should be no hesitation on that score. At the same time, it should be ensured that those who have been earning their livelihood honestly are encouraged and given due facilities. These people could be issued licenses for business, like 'Rehriwalas', in various localities of the Capital, and in place of 'Khokhas', kiosks or some cabin shelter should be constructed for them. In this way, the surroundings will not look shabby, and those dislodged from 'Khokhas' will have no reason for complaint. I would like to see, in the next couple of months, in phase I, that these kiosks or cabins have been constructed.

2. I noticed that maintenance of Government quarters is very poor. I would like Chairman CDA to work out a plan for their maintenance on a regular basis. I would also like him to negotiate with private entrepreneurs for running private



transport service between Faizabad Chowk and Secretariat. This would relieve the common man from the ordeal of waiting for hours at bus stands.

3. On my next round of the Federal Capital, I would like to see it look much smarter than it did during my visit on 30 Oct 79.

ii. Recently CDA has initiated a project to construct wells a 100 Nos. locations with approximate cost of Rs. 125.000 (Million), aiming to replenish the de-pleting ground water level.

Sheikh Rashid Ahmed: (a) List of Assistant Directors / Deputy Assistant Director posted in Pak ID Department of NADRA is at **(Annex-A)**.

(b) PAK ID department was established to provide hi-tech online processing support of Smart ID/ FRC/Smart NICOP/ POC to all overseas Pakistanis without their physical presence. Thus, qualified officers/ officials with significant experience in the field of registration are trained as subject matter experts (SME) to analyze and process online applications after proper verification as per NADRA Registration policy.

(c) There is no rotation policy of NADRA which requires transfer of such trained SME to other functional areas.

Sheikh Rashid Ahmed: (a) ➤ Under section 37 of Prevention of Electronic Crimes Act (PECA) 2016, Pakistan Telecommunication Authority (PTA) is empowered to control (remove or block) the blasphemous content.

➤ FIA forwards blasphemous content to PTA for necessary action.

➤ Total numbers of such cases forwarded by FIA to PTA in last three years are **256**.

(b) During the last three years, **66** cases have been registered by FIA.

(c) Till date, punishment has been given by the Court of Law only in one case. Out of eight convicts in that case, four are absconders while punishment has been awarded to the rest of four.

1. After 18th constitutional amendment, Ministry of Health was devolved leading to devolution of powers to Provincial Government. However, 4 x Model Addiction Treatment & Rehabilitation Centers (MATRCs) are establish which are being managed by ANF. The MATRCs provide free of cost treatment, boarding and lodging facilities to the drug addicts including female and juvenile drug addicts. The details of MATRCs are given below:-

2. Last survey of drug users in Pakistan "Drug Use in Pakistan" was carried out by Pakistan Bureau of Statistics in 2012 in collaboration with Ministry of Narcotics Control (then NCD) & UNODC. The final report/ result of the survey was published in year 2013 under heading "Drug Use in Pakistan - 2013". As per the survey report 2013, approximately 6 % or 6.7 million people between the age of 15-64 years were using any of the illicit drugs including misuse of prescription drugs. After 2012, no drug use survey at country level has been conducted. Hence current status of drug use in the cities and number of drug users cannot be estimated accurately. As per Drug Use Survey in Pakistan - 2013, province-wise detail of drug users is as under:-

In order to discourage illegal occupation on Government land, major demolition operations have been carried out on regular basis without any fear in a non-discriminatory manner.

- These operational teams of Enforcement Directorate, CDA are rigorously undertaking action against illegal occupation on daily basis.
- The available record indicates that during the last three years, 3277 anti-encroachment operations have been carried out and confiscated 304090 of different items of encroachers. During these operations, 15980 different structures have also been demolished besides that 8500 Kanal land have been got vacated from adverse possession (**Annex-A**).

Mr. Muhammad Azam Khan Swati: (a) Railway Network in Balochistan Province mainly consist of Quetta Division having Dera Allah Yar Sibi-Quetta, Quetta-Chaman, Sibi-Khost, Spezend-Dalbandin-Taftan, Bostan-Zhob (closed). There are two passenger trains *i.e.* Jaffer Express (40Up, 39 Dn) and Chaman Passenger (349Up, 350Dn) working in Balochistan Province No stations has been closed during the last 15 years in Quetta Division (Balochistan Province).

(b) The overall length of railway track in Balochistan Province is 1470.36 KMs including the closed Bostan-Zhob section. Most of the track is more than 100 years old and on certain stretches of track, Engineering Speed Restrictions have been imposed due to deferred maintenance and owing to resource constraints, however, routine maintenance of track is being carried out with available resources.

To improve Railway services in Balochistan Province, following steps have been taken to improve the track structure:—

1. PC-I for 33.50 KMs track Rehabilitation through sleeper renewal between Quetta-Bostan on Quetta-Chaman section have been approved.
2. Following PC-Is for track rehabilitation has been processed for approval:—
 - a. 100-KMs Rehabilitation of track between Ahmedwal-Dalbadin on Quetta-Taftan section.
 - b. 100-KMs Rehabilitation of track between Nokundi-Kohi-Taftan on Quetta-Taftan section.
 - c. 160.024 KMs Rehabilitation of Track between Bostan-Chaman on Quetta-Chaman section.

3. Tourist train two trips have been started between Quetta-Bostan.
4. Bolan Mail Passenger train will also be started shortly.
5. Establishment of Chaman Terminal in collaboration with FBR and track renewal Sibi-Khost section is also in progress.
