Will the Minister Incharge of the Cabinet Division be pleased to state the present status of the Naya Pakistan Housing scheme indicating the number of housing units built and handed over to the allottees under the said scheme so far with location wise breakup?

Minister Incharge of the Cabinet Division:

1. **3,564** x Low Cost Housing Units (LCUs) of **WWF** and **18,499** of **Akhuwat Foundation** have been completed. **150,712** x LCUs are under construction and planning all over the **Country**. Balloting for 1,508 LCUs of WWF in Zone-V, Islamabad; 4,000 LCUs of LDA City Lahore; 2,000 LCUs of Farash Town, CDA, Islamabad; 839 LCUs of Raiwind, Sargodha and Chiniot and 300 LCUs of PHA Housing Scheme, Jalozai, Nowshera, KP has been conducted.
2. The cases of 9,563 applicants successful in Balloting for under construction housing units are in process for **Housing Finance**.

Minister Incharge of the Establishment Division: (a) Induction of officers from provincial services into PAS is made as per provisions contained in the Provincial Management Services (PMS) / Provincial Civil Services (PCS) induction into Pakistan Administrative Service Rules, 2020 notified *vide* SRO No. 274(I)/2021 dated 23-02-2021 (**Annex-I**).

***Question No. 28 Senator Dost Muhammad Khan:**

Will the Minister for Information Technology & Telecommunications be pleased to state:

- (a) *whether it is a fact that universal service fund is spent on the development of backward areas including Ex-FATA, if so, the details of developmental projects carried out in all provinces including Ex-FATA since 2015; and*
- (b) *the details of tendering procedures for awarding contracts of development projects under the said fund?*

Syed Amin-ul-Haque: (a) Universal Service Fund Company (USFCo) is mandated to provide access to telecommunication services to the underserved and unserved, rural and remote areas of the country. USFCo has launched multiple programs including Mobile Broadband Access and Optical Fiber Cable (OFC) projects in said areas. Mobile Broadband Access projects provided voice and broadband data services (3-G/ 4-G) in un/underserved areas. Under the same category, USFCo also initiated projects to provide coverage to unserved road segments of National Highways and Motorways.

Optic Fiber Cable (OFC) Projects have been designed to provide reliable high capacity backhaul to Broadband networks. USF, OFC Tehsil project aimed at connecting unserved Tehsil Headquarters/enroute Towns. To achieve deep fiberization, OFC Union Councils program has been initiated that connects Union Councils to national data backbone. USF has initiated multiple projects in all four provinces including ex-FATA region for provision of telecommunication services. Detail is attached **Annex-A**.

(b) In accordance with the Pakistan Telecommunication (Re-organization), Act 1996 and Universal Service Fund Rules 2006, as amended, USF conducts a reverse auction bidding process as per PPRA rules, for the award of subsidy to be paid to the successful applicant, to assist in meeting the costs of providing Telecommunication Services in identified un/underserved rural remote areas, for a contractual period of 10-years. As per Universal Service Fund Rules 2006, as amended, only licensed service providers who are contributors to the USF Fund are eligible to participate in the bidding process. The launch and award of projects are approved by the USF Board, which is fully authorized. The contracts are awarded to lowest bidders through open competitive bidding process.


The residents of Dheri Mera and adjoining areas approached the Senate's committee regarding Provision of Broadband Services at Dheri Mera, Union Council Salhad, Abbottabad.

2. PTA conducted the joint survey in order to identify the exact issue (survey copy attached). Following 4 locations were marked for the survey:

- a. **Location 1:** Main road just in front of mosque Abdullah Bin Masood (RA). (34.122639, 73.167667)
- b. **Location 2:** Ayesha Siddiqa (RA) Islamic Montessori on link road to village Dheri (34.123861, 73.168583)
- c. **Location 3:** Trehri Market (34.122056, 73.16025)
- d. **Location 4:** Shah di Galli, in front Govt School (34.12125, 73.154194)

3. After the survey, it is observed that first two (2) out of these four (4) locations lack adequate data services.

4. Foregoing in view, USF is requested to see the feasibility of providing data services in location 1 and 2 under small lot/program, please.

Coverage and QoS Issues at Dheri Mera, UC Salhad, Abbottabad

Survey Report (28th October 2021)

Background

1. The residents of UC Dheri Mera and adjoining areas approached the Senate's committee acknowledging the last survey, however, complained that survey of remaining two CMOs (i.e. Telenor & Zong) was not done and overall the CMOs be directed to take necessary steps for improvement in QoS (complaint placed at **Annex-A**). In order to address the concerns of the people of the area, a comprehensive joint survey was planned for 28th October 2021.

Comprehensive Joint Survey

2. In order to identify the exact problematic areas contact was made with complainants as mentioned on the complaint letter. Mr. Ajmal Khan referred to another resident of the area i.e. Mr. Waqas. Resultantly, following four locations were marked for joint survey along with Mr. Waqas:

- a. **Location # 1.** Main road just in front of mosque Abdullah Bin Masood (RA).
- b. **Location # 2.** Ayesha Siddiqa (RA) Islamic Montessori on link road to village Dheri
- c. **Location # 3.** Trehri Market
- d. **Location # 4.** Shah di Galli, in front Govt School

Pictures of these locations are attached as Annex-B.

3. The joint survey was headed by Member (Compliance & Enforcement) PTA and senior technical as well regulatory representatives of the four CMOs were present. Tests were made to check voice ~~calls~~ as well as data (3G/4G) services at the mentioned locations.

4. The results of each CMO are summarised below:

* Service were found but the standard was much below the threshold and concerned CMOs do not claim coverage.

Observations

5. Following are the major observations:
- Jazz managed to establish 5 out of 10 calls at Location 1, however, call setup time was 17.7 seconds. At location # 2, 7 out of 10 calls were successful, but the call setup time was 14.2 seconds and only 2 SMS attempts were successful.
 - Ufone had very weak and sporadic signals at location # 2 and 3 where only a few calls were established but did not meet the threshold.
 - Telenor had no coverage at any of the mentioned locations.
 - Zong has good quality for both voice and data at location # 3 and 4 only. All the parameters for voice and data were met at these locations. Data rate for 4G was 4.9 Mbps and 18.4 Mbps at location 3 and 4 respectively.

Conclusion

6. On the basis of above-mentioned survey findings/observations, following is concluded:
- The area falls in the suburbs of Abbottabad city and neither included in district HQs nor Tehsil HQs.
 - Location # 1 and 2 have sporadic coverage of Jazz and Ufone.
 - Zong has very good coverage and quality for both voice and data (4G) at location # 3 and 4.
 - Due to hilly terrain, it is not possible to provide same coverage/quality at each point in the area.
 - The coverage/QoS changes exaggeratedly with every new turn around the mountain.
 - The business case does not seem strong for installation of any new BTS.

Will the Minister for Housing and Works be pleased to state that:

- whether it is a fact that existing rental ceilings of Government employees BS1-2 are extremely low compare to the rental ceilings of employees in BS-3-6 and is not sufficient to hire any accommodation in Rawalpindi or Islamabad, if so, reasons thereof; and*
- whether there is any proposal under consideration to equalize the rental ceiling of BS1-2 of Government employees to those*

in BS3-6, if so, the time by which the ceilings of the said employees will be equalized and if not, reasons therefor?

Mr. Abdul Wasay: (a) Yes, it is a fact that the existing rental ceiling of Government employees in BS-1-2 scale is extremely low as compare to employees in BS-3-6, which is not sufficient to hire any accommodation in Rawalpindi or Islamabad. The problem can be resolved if rental ceiling for hiring of residential accommodation of Government employees in BS-1-10 scale, is at the same rate.

(b) No, there is no such proposal under consideration because of financial constraints.

***Question No. 30 Senator Kamran Murtaza:**

(Notice Received on 6/07/2022 at 11:10 Am) Qid: 39409

Will the Minister for Information Technology & Telecommunications be pleased to state:

- (a) *whether it is a fact that the 4G data and voice call services are not available at Deri Mara, Union Council Salhad, Abbottabad; and*
- (b) *the steps are being taken by the Government and the Universal Service Fund to provide 4G data and voice call services in the said area and the time by which the same will be provided?*

Syed Amin-ul-Haque: (a) Under Section 33B of The Pakistan Telecommunication (Re-organization) Act, 1996 (as amended), USF has been mandated to provide access to telecommunication services in the unserved, underserved, rural and remote areas. Any area that already has voice & broadband data services (3G/4G) of even a single operator is considered served from UST' perspective and already served areas are beyond USF mandate.

According to survey report shared by PTA, two locations of the area Dheri Mera, UC Salhad, Abbottabad *i.e.* Mosque Abdullah Bin Masood (RA) -34.122639, 73.167667 and Ayesha Siddiqa (RA) Islamic Montessori/link road village Dheri- 34.123861, 73.168583 were found lacking adequate telecommunication services, whereas other two locations *i.e.* Trehri Market-34.123861, 73.168583 and Shah Di Galli 34.12125, 73.154194 were identified as served area. **(Detail is at Annex-A).**

(b) Populated areas in the proximity of all these locations have been re-analysed w.r.t latest coverage data received from all CMOs in June 2022 and found to be lacking adequate telecommunication services. Therefore, these locations have been included in the USF project namely NG-BSD Abbottabad Lot which is targeting the unserved and underserved areas of districts Abbottabad, Mansehra, Haripur, Batagram and Torghar.

Estimate project completion duration is 12-months. Bids for the project are scheduled to be received in October, 2022 (subject to successful bidding process/award of project).

- (a) *whether it is a fact that Sector G-14 particularly its sub-sector G-14/1 is under illegal occupation for the last more than 15 years but the Government has failed to get it vacated and hand over possession of plots to its allottees, if so, reasons thereof; and*
- (b) *whether it is also a fact that the Government has been carrying out developmental schemes like carpeting of streets, roads and drainage etc. in the said area for those illegal occupants, if so, the reasons thereof?*

Mr. Abdul Wasay: (a) It is apprised that affectees of the area had approached Islamabad High Court (IHC) with the plea to assess/measure illegal built-up properties (BUPS) along-with GIS based old and genuine BUPS. The matter remained/is still subjudice and the Honourable IHC is hearing the case every second or third day. The honourable IHC has directed to finish measurement of BUPS of Sector G-14/2 first. Regarding Sub-Sector G-14/1, FGEHA has requested IHC to direct members of the affectees committee to coordinate on daily basis for measurement of legal/illegal BUPS.

- (b) a. FGEHA has not executed any works in Sub-Sector G-14/1, Islamabad; since the access was not granted to FGEHA and its survey teams by local occupants.
- b. Local occupants May have executed works on their own or through any other department for their basic needs and access to residential/commercial units.
