- (a) the qualification, experience and age limit for the appointment of the Chairman and Members of the Federal Service Tribunal (FST);
- (b) the perks, privileges and other benefits being drawn by the Chairman and Members of the Tribunal;
- (c) the budget allocated and utilized by the Tribunal during the last three years with year wise break up;
- (d) the total number of cases pending in the Tribunal, disposal rate, causes for delay and steps being taken for expeditious disposal of the cases; and
- (e) whether it is fact that majority of the Members serving in the Tribunal have no legal background, if so, the details and the reasons thereof?

Mr. Azam Nazeer Tarar: (a) The Chairman and Members of the Federal Service Tribunal are appointed under the *Service Tribunals Act,* 1973, which provides as under:—

Sub-section (3) of Section 3 of the said Act, amended as aforesaid, provides that a Tribunal shall consists of –

- (a) a Chairman, being a person who has been, or is qualified to be judge of a High Court;
- (b) such number of members not less than three, each of whom is or has been:
 - (i) a District Judge; or
 - (ii) a person who, for a period of not less than two years, has held a post in BS-21 or above or equivalent under the Federal Government or a Provincial Government with adequate quasi-judicial or legal experience, preference being given to a person having background of dealing with service matters; or

(iii) an Advocate qualified for appointment as Judge of a High Court.

There is no provision of age limit in the Service Tribunals Act, 1973, for appointment of Chairman and Members FST, Further the Chairman and Members are appointed by the President of the Islamic Republic of Pakistan for a non-extendable term of three years under subsection (4) of Section 3 of the Act *ibid*. However, mostly retired District & Sessions Judges / retired officers of BS-21/22 and retired Judges of Supreme Court / High Court are appointed as Members and Chairman of the FST, respectively.

- (b) The Chairman, of FST, is entitled to the perks, privileges and other benefits as admissible to a Judge of High Court as provided in the terms and conditions of Chairman notified by the Establishment Division vide Notification S.R.O No, 1016(I)183, dated 23-10-1983 (Annex-A). Whereas; Members (Executive & Judicial) have been allowed MP-I Scale w,e.f. 01-07-2018 vide Establishment Division's Notifications dated 30-05-2018 and 16-10-2019 (Annex-B & C). Further, the perks & privileges and other benefits admissible to the officers placed in MP Scales are notified by the Finance Division vide O.M dated 14-07-2017 (Annex-D) Monthly Salary and allowances drawn Chairman/Members of FST is at **Annex-E**.
- (c) The budget allocated and utilized by the Tribunal during the last three Financial Years is attached at "Annex-F".
- (d) Detail of number of cases 'pending' and 'disposed of', is attached at "Annex-G". The main cause of the delay in cases is repeated adjournments preferred by the parties. However, the Tribunal benches are working efficiently to reduce the pendency expeditiously and dispensing justice according to law. The Federal Service Tribunal is committed to deliver speedy justice to the civil servants by quick disposal of cases.
- (e) The Chairman and Members of the FST have been appointed by the President, Islamic Republic of Pakistan with prior concurrence/consultation with the Hon'ble Chief Justice of Pakistan in line with Supreme Court of Pakistan's Judgment titled "Sh. Riaz-ul-Haq Vs FoP" reported as PLD 2013 SC 501. Each Bench comprises two Members one from Executive side and the other from Judiciary. All the Executive Members are also as per Sub-section 3(b) of Section 3 of Service Tribunals Act, 1973.

Will the Minister for Water Resources be pleased to state:

- (a) whether it is a fact that WAPDA was restructured in 1991-92, if so, the rational behind the restructuring; and
- (b) whether it is also a fact that after restructuring, only Hydel generation had remained with WAPDA, while its other functions were transferred if so, its reasons?

Syed Khursheed Ahmed Shah: (a)

- Restructuring (unbundling) of WAPDA was not carried out in 1991-92 rather a study was carried out under the title "Strategic Plan for Privatization of Water Wing of WAPDA", which was conducted under a World Bank initiative. The Strategic Plan was approved by Council of Common Interests (CCI) in 1993 and as learnt from the record of the then Ministry of Water & Power, Pakistan Electric Power Company (PEPCO) was given the mandate under the executive orders of the Prime Minister of Pakistan *vide* U.O No. 11(22)E&F-1/98 dated 24-10-1998 to implement the Strategic Plan.
- Therefore, bifurcation of WAPDA was carried out by PEPCO under the direction of the erstwhile Ministry of Water & Power.

(b)

• Yes, after restructuring only Hydel Generation remained with WAPDA. All actions were undertaken in compliance of the

Strategic Plan approved by the Council of Common Interests (CCI). It may be mentioned that PEPCO is presently a part of the Ministry of Energy (Power Division).

*Question No. 40 **Senator Mushtaq Ahmed:** (Notice Received on 8/03/2023 at 9:48 AM) QID: 40532

Will the Minister for Energy (Power Division) be pleased to state:

- (a) whether it is a fact that the employees of the power distribution companies not only facilitate power theft but also sell free units entitled to them, if so, indicating details of action taken against the culprits from 2010-2023;
- (b) whether any proposal is under consideration to monetize the free electric units facility?
- Mr. Khurram Dastagir Khan: (a) No cases have been reported in DISCOs where employees have been found involved in selling of free supply units. However, detail of disciplinary cases initiated against DISCO employees on account of involvement/facilitation in theft of electricity is placed as Annex-X.
- (b) No any proposal is under consideration to monetize the free electricity units facility.

Will the Minister for Human Rights be pleased to state whether it is a fact that the Ministry had advertised vacancy of Deputy Director/project Manager (BS-18) on 3rd November, 2022 for the Project of "Establishment of Transgender Protection Center" if so, the details of applications received and criteria laid down for shortlisting and appointment against the same?

Mian Riaz Hussain Pirzada: Ministry advertised vacancy of Deputy Director /Project Manager (BS-18) on 03-11-2022 for the Project

of "Establishment of Transgender Protection Centre." Total applicants (candidates) were 515. No applicant was found eligible for appointment against the post. The experience for the post was revised from five to four years and qualification for the post with approval of DDWP. The post was re-advertised on 07-02-2023.

Total applicants (candidates) were 815. The Shortlisting Committee shortlisted three (03) candidates by taking into consideration the requisite criteria. Appointment against the post of Deputy Director/Project Manager (BS-18) was made by fulfilling the prescribed procedure.

*Question No. 44 **Senator Bahramand Khan Tangi:** (Notice Received on 11/05/2023 at 11:20 PM) QID: 40782

Will the Minister for Human Rights be pleased to state the steps taken by the Government to implement the Citizen Welfare Act, 2021 regarding facilitation of senior citizens in Islamabad?

Mian Riaz Hussain Pirzada: Islamabad Capital Territory Senior Citizens Act, 2021 has been promulgated *w.e.f* 22nd July, 2021, to protect the rights of Senior Citizens at ICT level. Following steps have been taken by Ministry of Human Rights to implement the ICT Senior Citizens Act, 2021 regarding facilitation of Senior Citizens in Islamabad:—

- 1. In pursuance of Section 3 (1) and Section 4 of the Islamabad Capital Territory Citizens Act, 2021, the Senior Citizens Council has been constituted and notified (Annex-I).
- 2. The first meeting of the council was held on 19-01-2023. The Council approved its draft financial and administrative rules. The Council also approved constitution of its Executive Committee and Organogram of the Secretariat of the Council besides creation of posts as mentioned in organogram of the Secretariat of the Council (Annex-II).
- 3. Ministry of Human Rights has notified Executive Committee of the ICT Senior Citizens (Annex-III). Ministry of Human Rights, in collaboration with Help Age International (NGO) have conducted three workshops to create awareness in the public about senior citizens rights, in the light of ICT Senior Citizens Act, 2021.

Will the Minister for Human Rights be pleased to state:

- (a) whether it is a fact that being a signatory to the International Covenant on Civil and Political Rights (ICCPR), 1966 Pakistan has not ratified 1st Optional Protocols under the said Covenant, if so, reason thereof; and
- (b) the details of optional protocols of the said Covenant which Pakistan has ratified so far?

Mian Riaz Hussain Pirzada: (a) Government of Pakistan has ratified International Covenant on Civil and Political Rights on 23rd June 2010. However, Government of Pakistan has not signed or ratified the First Optional Protocol to ICCPR related to giving jurisdiction to the Human Rights Committee to adjudicate on individual complaints. Reasons are as under:

- There is great likelihood of Pakistan facing a barrage of false accusations and complaints from individuals and responding to such complaints will be very time consuming.
- Consideration of signing/ratification of such obligations requires consensus among the stakeholders.
- There is no such condition that any State, being party to the ICCPR, has to sign/ratify the Optional Protocols.
- Besides, it is pertinent to mention that as per information available on UN Human Rights Treaty Bodies website, only Government of Nepal in the region has accepted the complaint mechanism provided under the above-referred protocol, so far.
- (b) The International Covenant on Civil and Political Rights has two Optional Protocols. The First Optional Protocol gives jurisdiction to Human Rights Committee to hear complaints related to the rights protected under the Covenant and the Second Optional Protocol to the International Covenant on Civil and Political Rights aiming to the abolition of the death penalty

stipulates abolition of the death penalty. Government Pakistan has neither signed nor ratified any of the Optional Protocols.

Will the Minister for Energy (Power Division) be pleased to state whether it is a fact that presently there is unscheduled load shedding of electricity in District Chitral, if so, reasons thereof and the time by which the issue gets resolved?

Mr. Khurrum Dastagir Khan: Scheduled load management is being implemented on all the 11 kV Feeders of Khyber Pakhtunkhwa (in PESCO's: jurisdiction) including District Chitral according to the proportionate Aggregate Technical & Commercial (AT&C) Loss on the Feeders.

It is apprised that no un-scheduled load shedding of electricity in District Chitral is being carried out. However, following are the reasons for power outages in addition to the scheduled load management. Resolution of problems takes time on case to case basis:

- Faults(s) occurrence.
- Emergency PTWs for restoration of Power Supply.
- Lengthy feeder which results into frequents faults.
- Approved shutdowns / PTWs for the developmental activates/ maintenance of the distribution system.
- Forced load management due to generation shortfall.
- No time frame work can be given for resolving the issues of load management. However, the same can only be reduced or minimized by reducing AT&C loss which is also reliant on timely payment against bills by the consumers.

Mian Riaz Hussain Pirzada: Ministry of Human Rights is mandated to implement international obligations related to Seven Core Human Rights Conventions, ratified by the Government of Pakistan, Universal Periodic Review (UPR) including Convention against Torture and other Cruel, Inhuman or Degrading Treatment or Punishment (CAT). Ministry also submit the implementation reports to EU under GSP Plus Scheme.

During 3rd Biennial Review in 2018 European Union has asked Government of Pakistan to take steps for adoption of the Torture, Custodial Death and Custodial Rape (Prevention and Punishment) Bill.

This Ministry prepared the draft Bill and handed over the said Bill to the Ministry of Interior being the relevant Ministry, as per Rules of Business. The draft Bill was introduced in the National Assembly on 29-9-2021 by Ministry of Interior. The National Assembly cleared the Bill on 1st August, 2022. Thereafter, Senate has passed the subject Bill on 20th October, 2022. After the assent of President of Pakistan on 1st November, 2022. The Torture and Custodial Death (Prevention and Punishment) Act, 2022 has been promulgated.
