

RESOLUTION NO. 558

"The Senate of Pakistan commemorates World Humanitarian Day on August 19th and recognizes the selfless efforts of humanitarian workers and organizations who strive to save and protect human lives across the globe and to reduce human suffering;

The House also honors those frontline humanitarian workers who have lost their lives in the line of duty;

This House particularly shows appreciation for the humanitarian assistance extended to Pakistan by the global community during last year's devastating floods;

The Senate notes with alarm that humanitarian workers worldwide continue to remain vulnerable to violence and attacks, with major attacks numbering 235 in 2022 alone, including 1 in Pakistan, undermining the safety and security of those dedicated to saving lives and delivering assistance;

The Senate calls upon the Government of Pakistan to enhance its support for humanitarian efforts, both within its borders and beyond, through diplomatic, financial, and logistical means, in partnership with other governments and multilateral organizations;

The Senate demands that all governments, including the government of Pakistan enhance measures to provide better security to humanitarian workers.

RESOLUTION NO. 559

"Expressing its deep concern over the present situation emerging in the areas of Dasu and Diamer bhasha dams;

This House recommends that:

- 1. the locals should be recruited in the said projects as per the quota fixed for them
- 2. the salary of persons working in the said projects should not be less than the minimum wages, i. e. Rupees thirty two thousand per month, as fixed by the Government in the budget for current fiscal year;
- 3. the laborers working in those projects should be paid at least Rs. 1500 per day as per Government policy;
- 4. the Government should provide compensation to all the affecttees of those projects under the "chola package";
- 5. The Government should take all necessary steps to utilize the amount allocated for construction of roads, schools and other facilities in the affected areas in consultation with local elders of Kohistan on merit basis:
- 6. necessary funds should be released and work on the Kandia valley road should be expedited and completed at the earliest; and
- 7. the amount fixed for welfare works should be utilized for the welfare of the people of those areas with consultation of local elders and that reasonable demands of the people should be accepted and fulfilled so that the work on those projects may be completed amicably without any hurdle".
