- The Committee considered and discussed the Bill in detail in its 4. meeting held on 16th June, 2017. The Committee was briefed on the salient features of amendment in the Post Office Act 1898. It was informed that proposed amendments in Section 45 and in proviso to Section 45 of Post Office Act, 1898 were drafted in view to address the genuine problem and to facilitate the customers, the customers are facing serious difficulties / inconvenience. Under existing provisions the maximum denomination value of Postal Order is up-to Rs.50, and the maximum limit was last revised in 1973 from Rs.10 to Rs.50 which does not cater to the requirements of the present day users. It was further briefed that the said amendment has been proposed thereby to remove the barrier of maximum limit of Rs.50 and to issue Postal orders of appropriate denominations as per requirements of the customers.
- After discussion and deliberation, the Committee recommends that the Bill titled "The Post Office (Amendment) Bill, 2017" may be passed by the House as introduced in the Senate.

BILL

further to amend the Post Office Act, 1898

WHEREAS it is expedient to amend the Post Office Act, 1898 (VI of 1898), for the purposes hereinafter appearing;

It is hereby enacted as follows:-

- 1. Short title and commencement.- (1) This Act may be called the Post Office (Amendment) Act, 2017.
 - (2) It shall come into force at once.
- 2. Amendment of section 45, Act VI of 1898.- In the Post Office Act, 1898 (VI of 1898), in section 45, the following amendments shall be made, namely:-
 - (a) after the word "form", the words "and of such amount" shall be inserted;
 - (b) for the semicolon at the end, a full stop shall be substituted; and
 - (c) the proviso shall be omitted.

STATEMENT OF OBJECTS AND REASONS

The Bill seeks to achieve the object to provide for the issuance of postal orders having their value more than fifty rupees for the use and benefit of general public.
