DEFERRED QUESTION

(Question No. 75 deferred on 18th September, 2015 (119th Session))

(Def.)* Question No. 75. **Senator Nuzhat Sadiq :
(Notice received on 09-07-2015 at 11:50 a.m.)

Will the Minister for Law, Justice and Human Rights be pleased to state:

- (a) *whether it is a fact that provisions of Juvenile Justice System Ordinance, 2000 regarding establishment of juvenile courts in each district and juvenile specific detention centers etc. have not been implemented so far, if so, the reasons thereof; and*
- (b) *the steps being taken by the Government to ensure implementation of all provisions of the said ordinance in letter and spirit?*

Mr. Pervaiz Rashid : (a) Under the Rule of Business, 1973, the subject matter falls under the domain of Ministry of Interior and Provincial Home Departments. Accordingly, letters were sent to the relevant federal and provincial government departments to furnish the requisite information. Subsequent reminders were also issued. Despite that the information from the quarters concerned is still awaited, it is however mentioned that the Juvenile Justice System Ordinance (JJSO) was promulgated in the year 2000. Under Section 4 of the said Law, it is required to establish Juvenile Courts. In pursuance of that the High Courts have conferred powers of Juvenile Courts to the Court of Sessions and Judicial Magistrate 1st Class in each district. Furthermore, detention centers have been established in the following areas:

- **Punjab:** Faisalabad and Bahawalpur
- **Sindh:** Youthful Offenders Industrial School at Karachi, Hyderabad, Larkana and Sindh Reformatory School at Karachi
- **Khyber Pakhtunkhwa:** Banu, Peshawar and Haripur.

- Furthermore, separate wards in each District/ Central Jail have been setup to detain juveniles exclusively, all over the country.

(b) To implement JJSO 2000 the following measures are being taken:—

- All the four provinces including Islamabad Capital Territory (ICT) have notified Rules of the JJSO.
- 220 juvenile courts across the country are adjudicating upon the matters where accused persons are juveniles.
- During the custody, juvenile offenders are detained separately, and not with an adult accused.
- 27 Panels of Lawyers have been notified across the country by different district courts to provide free legal assistance to the needy and poor children.
- No juvenile offender has been awarded capital punishment (death penalty) in any case after the promulgation of JJSO in the year 2000.
- As per provisions of JJSO, courts prefer to release juvenile offenders on bail by taking lenient view.
- The number of probation officers has increased from 58 in 2008, to 97 (including 13 female probation officers) in 2011. This led to an increase in the number of children on probation from 145 children in 2008 to 250 children in 2011 released on probation.
- Moreover, a detention center for the Juveniles is being established at Islamabad.

Will the Minister for Housing and Works be pleased to state:

- (a) *whether it is a fact that some Police officials are illegally occupying Government's flats/residences in Islamabad, if so, the number of such officials and the action taken against them; and*
- (b) *the steps taken or being taken to get the said flats/residences vacated ?*

Mr. Akram Khan Durrani : (a) Yes, It is a fact that 197 Police officials are illegally occupying government flats / houses in Islamabad. To get vacated these flats houses from ICT Police officials, meetings at officers level were conducted and with the help of internal enforcement officials of Estate Office, efforts were made to get vacated.

(b) Policy is being formulated to settle this issue of illegal occupant in Ministry of Housing & Works.

***Question No. 88. Senator Muhammad Talha Mehmood:**

(Notice received on 15-06-2015 at 09:50 a.m.)

Will the Minister for Water and Power be pleased to state:

- (a) the year in which the last audit of accounts of WAPDA was conducted; and*
- (b) whether any irregularity was surfaced in the report of the said audit, if so, the details thereof and the action taken in the light of that report?*

Khawaja Muhammad Asif : (a & b) Audit of accounts of WAPDA has been conducted upto 30-06-2014. Irregularities pointed out as a result of Audit have been printed in the Audit Report 2014-15, which is under submission to National Assembly. The irregularities pertain to the issues of irregular/unjustified payment, mis-classification, weakness of internal controls, recoveries and overpayments to the employee/contractors etc. The recommendations of Audit are being followed up by the department for corrective action in the light of decisions of Departmental Accounts Committee (DAC). Some of the compliance have been made while other are in the process of implementation by WAPDA.

Will the Minister for Housing and Works be pleased to state:

- (a) the details of complaints received against the officials of the Estate Office, Islamabad during the last five years indicating also the names of officials against whom the same were received and action taken in each case; and*
- (b) the steps taken/being taken by the Government to make the said office corruption free?*

Mr. Akram Khan Durrani : (a) Twenty complaints were received against the officials of the Estate Office, Islamabad during last five years on various charges. The names of the accused Officers / Officials and action taken is at Annex-I.

(b) Following steps have been taken to make the office corruption free:—

- i. Merit policy as described in Accommodation Allocation Rules 2002 in allotment of Government accommodation to employees of Federal Government Ministries/Divisions and their attached departments is being observed to bring the corruption at zero level.
- ii. Powers delegated to Federal Government to relax any rule governing allotment of accommodation to eligible Federal Government Servants in public interest for

deserving and hardship cases are not being exercised to bring transparency and equality to minimize different kinds of corruption.

- iii. General Waiting List has been placed on website of the M/o Housing and Works (Estate Office) for easy access of general public and to bring transparency in the working of department.
- iv. Strict vigilance on working of Estate Office is being conducted by M/o Housing and Works on regular basis to make the department corruption free.

Will the Minister for Housing and Works be pleased to state the names and locations of the ongoing housing schemes of the Federal Government Employees Housing Foundation (FGEHF) indicating also the number of plots, date/year of starting the work, present status of work and expected date of completion in each case?

Mr. Akram Khan Durrani : The detail of ongoing schemes launched by the FGE Housing Foundation are as under:—

Development work will be starting soon.

Present Status:

Due to reluctance in honoring its obligations by M/s Green Tree, litigation started and the matter remained subjudice in Islamabad High Court. Recently, as a result of NAB intervention, an addendum is being prepared by the both parties *i.e.* Housing Foundation and M/s Green Tree.

M/s Green Tree is being bound to provide developed plots as per agreement. It is, therefore, expected that the development work on the scheme shall be started soon and completed without further delay. On the other hand, the consent letters alongwith brochure has been sent to the *bonafide* successful applicants under membership drive on the basis “first come first serve”. The formal Provisional Offer letter shall be issued accordingly.

*Question No. 91. **Senator Muhammad Daud Khan Achakzai Advocate :**
(Notice received on 31-07-2015 at 11:15 a.m.)

Will the Minister for Water and Power be pleased to state the present status of work on Neelum Jehlum Hydel Power Project indicating also the date of commencement of work, original and revised estimated cost and the date of completion of that project?

Khawaja Muhammad Asif :

- Upto-date physical progress is 74%.
- The contract for construction of NJHEP was awarded at a cost of Rs. 90.909 billion in December 2007 whereas the execution of work commenced in January 2008 with completion as October, 2015.
- 1st revised PC-I amounting to Rs. 84.502 billion was approved by ECNEC in February 2002. However, the project cost increased in view of design review by the Project Consultants due to 2005 earthquake, shifting of Dam & Power House locations, concrete lining of Headrace Tunnel (HRT) instead of shotcrete lining and shallow crossing of HRT under Jhelum River etc. which necessitated the revision of the PC-I at the very beginning of the project execution.
- Accordingly 2nd Revised PC-I (2012) amounting to Rs. 274.882 billion was approved by ECNEC on 3rd July 2013 with revised date of completion as November, 2016.

- To counter the effects of the currency exchange loss and Duties & Taxes, 3rd revised PC-I amounting to Rs. 414.034 billion is under approval in the Planning Commission.

*Question No. 92. **Senator Muhammad Daud Khan Achakzai Advocate :**

(Notice received on 31-07-2015 at 11:10 a.m.)

Will the Minister for Water and Power be pleased to state:

- whether it is a fact that water table in Balochistan is going lower and lower day by day, if so, remedial measures being taken by the Federal Government in this regard; and*
- the details of ongoing and proposed projects of construction of dams in the said province indicating also the estimated cost and capacity of each dam?*

Khawaja Muhammad Asif : (a) Balochistan Province is in the arid zone with low rainfall and large evapotranspiration losses. With the introduction of deep-well pumping in the last 3-4 decades, groundwater resources have been rapidly depleted and levels have declined. In 10 of 19 sub-basins, groundwater is overused. At this stage, groundwater use exceeds recharge by 22%. Pishin Lora accounts for the largest imbalance.

The main intervention for groundwater recharge has been the development of recharge reservoirs, called as delay actions dams that have been constructed in Balochistan since the 1970s and now exceed 300 in number. Their aim is to intercept flood water and retain it for groundwater recharge. Typical individual capacity of these dams is around average of 800 to 1000 acre feet, but there is wide variation. While the first generation of delay action dams in Balochistan was not successful, the new generation has fared much better because of better siting and because the impounded water was recharged through the downstream riverbed by means of water released from the storage reservoir. Where they were constructed, downstream water levels typically rose by 1.4 meters. Specifically, M/o Water & Power is also funding for construction of 10 delay action dams in entire Balochistan. 20 dams have been completed under the Phase I of this project and in Phase II 26 dams are at various stages of completion. In Phase III the Government of Pakistan has earmarked 10 delay action dams for which the Government of Balochistan is preparing the PC-1.

Besides above it is stated that groundwater is a provincial topic wherein the local management is a prime challenge; federal management is limited to general policies and support. In this regard to relieve some pressure on the groundwater aquifer of Quetta, the Government of Balochistan is in the process of preparation of PC-1 of Mangi dam which will be submitted shortly to the Federal Government. To ensure its early, implementation Ministry of Water & Power has made a tentative provision in the current PSDP of Rs 500 million. Furthermore the Government of Pakistan has made funding provisions for of Basol and Shadi Kaur dams.

WAPDA was also assigned the task of construction of Small/Medium dams to conserve water in less developed, remote and far-flung areas of Balochistan. In Phase-I, five Small/Medium dams are under different stages of planning, award and construction.

Khawaja Muhammad Asif : (a) Yes; it is a fact that electricity distribution system has become old and its rehabilitation is a continuous process. The concerned DISCO takes different steps for rehabilitation/up gradation of the distribution network, as per detail given in part (b).

***Question No. 95. Senator Nuzhat Sadiq :**

(Notice received on 17-08-2015 at 03:00 p.m.)

Will the Minister for Water and Power be pleased to state whether it is a fact that a huge quantum of water which flow up-stream to sea go on unused particularly in monsoon season, if so, whether there is any proposal under consideration of the Government to tap this water for the use of agriculture and generation of electricity, if so, the details thereof?

Khawaja Muhammad Asif : It is fact that during monsoon season unused quantum of water flows to sea because of water storage constraint.

The average (1976-2015) quantum of water annually escapes down to sea is 29.30 Million Acre Feet (MAF).

During the ongoing Kharif 2015 season (April 11, 2015 to September 11, 2015) the escapages below Kotri to sea are 35.86 MAF and still unutilized water to the extent of 46,900 Cusecs in flowing to sea (as on September 11, 2015).

The average (1976-2015) river water availability in the country is 144.57 MAF against which the storage capacity is 14.12 MAF including raised Mangla, which is 9.8 % only.

WAPDA has prepared comprehensive plan to tap water during high flow season and utilize the same during lean season for agriculture & generation of electricity. The detail of projects under construction, ready for construction and under planning are as under:—

Will the Minister for Law, Justice and Human Rights be pleased to state whether there is any proposal under consideration of the Government to bring different statues / laws, which deal with similar nature of offences into one statue / law?

Mr. Pervaiz Rashid : Presently there is no proposal under consideration of the Government to bring different statutes/ laws, which deal with similar nature of offences into one statutes / law.

***Question No. 97. Senator Mohammad Azam Khan Swati:**

(Notice received on 18-08-2015 at 12.32 p.m.)

Will the Minister for Water and Power be pleased to state:

- (a) the quantum of additional electricity produced / added by K-Electric during 2013-14;*
- (b) the quantum of electricity which will be produced / added by the said company during the year 2015 and 2016; and*
- (c) the date till which 650 MW electricity will be supplied to that company by WAPDA?*

Khawaja Muhammad Asif : (a) As informed by KE, it has made operational improvement in all areas of its business *i.e.* Generation, Transmission & Distribution. This has been done through investment of US\$ 1.2 billion through equity and debt. The details of capacity added is as under:

- 560 MW BQPS-II – Pakistan most efficient combined cycle power plant
- 247 MW CCPP Korangi
- 200 MW GE JB Korangi
- 50 MW rehabilitated from BQPS-I.

Since 2009, KE has also enhanced generation capacity by 1,057 MW.

(b) KE has its own future investment plans in place for next 3 to 5 years, which include an investment of up to US\$ 2 billion on account of key generation, transmission and distribution initiatives.

(c) The current Power Purchase Agreement expired in January 2015. Decision for renewal will be taken in light of CCI and Cabinet Decisions.

***Question No. 98. Senator Col. (R) Syed Tahir Hussain Mashhadi:**

(Notice received on 19-08-2015 at 12:00 p.m.)

Will the Minister for Housing and Works be pleased to state that whether there is any proposal under consideration of the Government to make available General Waiting List for allotment of Government accommodations in Islamabad in order to make the system of allotment of those accommodation more transparent, if so, when?

Mr. Akram Khan Durrani : The General Waiting List is already available on Estate Office website www.estateoffice.gov.pk.

***Question No. 99. Senator Col. (R) Syed Tahir Hussain Mashhadi:**

(Notice received on 19-08-2015 at 12:00 p.m.)

Will the Minister for Water and Power be pleased to state:

- (a) the name of countries with which Pakistan is presently negotiating for procurement of electricity indicating also the quantum of electricity proposed to be procured and rate at which the same will be procured; and*
- (b) the time by which supply of electricity from those countries will be started?*

Khawaja Muhammad Asif : (a) & (b) The requisite information is as under:

IRAN

- i. Import of 1000 MW which is extended to 3000MW @ 8.0-11.00 US cents per KWh for initial agreement.
- ii. Import of additional 30MW to enhance existing 74MW import to 104MW a 7.0 – 10.0 US cents per KWh.
- iii. Import of 100MW for Gawadar @ 6.25. US cents per KWh.
- iv. Due to sanctions on Iran; the time frame cannot be predicted. however for project at Sr ii., additional 30MW will be available by January 2016.

INDIA

Pakistan and India officials discussed in April, 2012 to import 500MW of power from India. Later M/s Adani Enterprises Ltd (AEL) India visited Pakistan on April, 2014 to discuss matters relating to export of power. AEL submitted draft to Ministry of Water & Power proposing export of 500 –800 MW power in 2-3 years as a starting, phase up to 3500 – 4000 MW capacity ultimately.

No further progress is made in the regard.

CASA-1000

The agreements for procurements of power under the CASA-1000 project is currently under implementation with following, countries:

- i. Tajikistan.
- ii. Kyrgyz Republic.

Pakistan is planning to import 1000 – 1300 MW during summer months from these countries. The feasibility based tariff is @ 9.41 US cents per KWh. The supply from project will start during summer of 2018.

*Question No. 100. **Senator Col. (R) Syed Tahir Hussain Mashhadi:**

(Notice received on 19-08-2015 at 12:00 p.m.)

Will the Minister for Petroleum and Natural Resources be pleased to state the names of foreign countries which have raised objections on Pak-Iran Pipeline Project since 2012-13 indicating also the details of objections raised by each of them and stance taken by the Government of Pakistan thereon?

Mr. Shahid Khaqan Abbasi : There are multilateral and unilateral sanctions imposed on Iran. The multilateral sanctions have been imposed by UN while the unilateral sanctions also imposed by US, UK, Canada & EU. There unilateral sanctions imposed by US are the most severe among all the international sanctions. Due to the magnitude and impact of these US sanctions, progress on Iran Pakistan gas pipeline project has been severely affected.

*Question No. 101. **Senator Nuzhat Sadiq :**

Will the Minister for Water and Power be pleased to state:

- (a) the parameters set down in Electricity Act, 1910 for laying aerial electricity cables, installation of transformers and other equipment in rural and urban areas of the country particularly with reference to protect the fundamental right of people to construct buildings at their properties;*
- (b) whether it is a fact that some distribution companies in the country have laid the said cables and installed the transformers and other equipments in rural and urban areas in violation of the said parameter;*
- (c) whether it is also a fact that distribution companies ask the affectee's to bear the cost of realignment of the cables and other installations if required for some construction or for making some other usage, if so, its reasons; and*
- (d) the steps being taken by the Government to allow the people to construct buildings at their own properties where the said infrastructure exists?*

Khawaja Muhammad Asif : (a) The parameters set down in Electricity act 1910 *vide* Chapter-VIII under the Title of Aerial Lines for laying aerial electricity cables installation of transformers and other equipment in rural and urban areas of the country particularly with reference to protect the Fundamental right of people to construct binidings as their properties is as under:—

- (i) Minimum strength of conductors of aerial lines.

- (ii) Maximum intervals between supports.
- (iii) Connection with earth of metal supports and stay-Wires.
- (iv) Factors of safety.
- (v) Height from ground and distance From buildings.
- (vi) Erection or alternation of buildings.

(b) No violation of above Parameters is being made by DISCOs.

(c) Yes, this is in line with the Electricity act 1910 Chapter-VIII Clause-69.

(d) No body is allowed for construction of houses/buildings under existing electricity net work. All such activities are illegal.

***Question No. 102. Senator Mohammad Azam Khan Swati:**

- (b) *whether any amount meant for the said work was utilized in Multan, Shangla, Larkana, or any other place in the country, if so, the quantum of the same; and*
- (c) *the steps being taken by the Government for completion of unfinished work on schools, hospitals and roads in Mansehra under rehabilitation program?*

Minister Incharge of the Prime Minister's Office : (a) the detail of amount spent by ERRA in AJK, Mansehra, Abbottabad, Batagram, Kohistan and other affected areas for rehabilitation and construction work in wake of 2005 earthquake is as under:—

(b) no amount meant for the said work was utilized in Multan and Larkana. However, an amount of Rs. 6,377.725 million has been spent in District Shangla.

(c) the steps being taken for completion of unfinished work on schools, hospitals, and roads in Mansehra are as under:—

- Out of 266 under construction projects in District Mansehra, 153 projects, having physical progress of above 50% are being followed vigorously for completion on priority.
- Besides designated Consultants, progress on all under construction projects is closely monitored by ERRA through its office including Monitoring and Evaluation Wing and as well as PERRA and SERRA.
- Projects' progress is reviewed on weekly / monthly basis.
